WHAT'S THE POLICING PLAN ALL ABOUT?

The Board must, legally, develop a Policing Plan for Northern Ireland which outlines how the Board and PSNI want to deliver and improve policing.

Before we make this plan we talk to lots of different people and groups. This is to make sure that the final plan considers the views of everyone and we particularly want to hear the views of children and young people.

This document allows **you** to give **your** views on the Policing Plan for 2025-2030.

We want to hear from you on or before the 10 December 2024.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

Effective policing keeps communities safe. PSNI cannot deliver effective policing alone; they work in partnership with the community and other organisations to achieve **Outcomes.**

The Policing Plan is one important part to the policing landscape in Northern Ireland. We do our work in a range of ways so while not everything is included in the Policing Plan, it will be included elsewhere like Local Policing Plans, PCSP Action Plans and Human Rights Thematic Reports.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE?

The draft Policing Plan has three Outcomes which are a way for the public to see if PSNI has delivered real change in communities, working alongside a variety of partners.

POLICING PLAN OUTCOME 1 PSNI IS VICTIM FOCUSED

Victims of crime will be treated with compassion and respect and kept informed in line with the principles of the Victims' Charter for Northern Ireland. The Police will target resources to protect the most vulnerable victims of crime, including repeat victims.
