MEETING IN PUBLIC

Due to the election and purdah restrictions, there was no monthly meeting in public in November. Members did however, meet in private with the Chief Constable where they questioned him on a range of public interest issues.

Director General of the National Crime Agency Lynne Owens presented recent reports to the Board and was questioned by members about money laundering,

tackling child exploitation and firearms as well as NCA support to the Paramilitary Crime Task Force.

Speaking about the meeting, Policing Board Chair Anne Connolly said: **“It is important that there are tangible benefits from the specialist work that the NCA brings to policing here and understanding of how that work impacts in terms of seizing criminal assets and tackling organised crime.”**

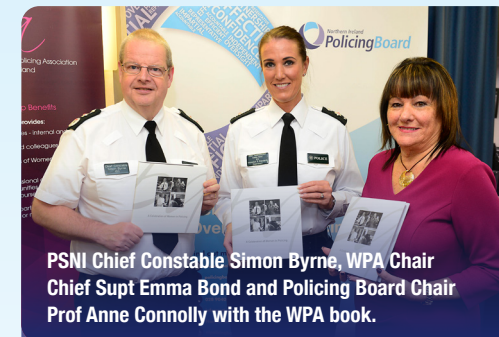
